

Every day we interact with vulnerable children, fully understanding that every child and every situation is different, which allows us to ensure each one gets the support they need to begin to heal. When you read those startling statistics, we urge you to remember that individual children make up those numbers, and to imagine what this journey looks like through their eyes.

In the coming year, we are increasing our focus on mental health support services. We know that child abuse affects a survivor's entire life, and that early mental health intervention can lead to dramatic, long-term improvements. We are beyond lucky to have so many helping hands in this community that lift us up as we grow and change with this delicate, vitally important work. We say it a lot, but that's because it's true — we literally cannot do this without you.
